

It was 1986 and I remember coming home from mum's work in the city, sitting in the back of their Ford Falcon, crawling in traffic on the freeway through Springwood.

I was 8 years old, but I can still remember that and it's one of the reasons I put up my hand to represent our community. To get this job done and finally fix the M1.

That's why this year, through the State Budget we'll invest another \$1.75B in the M1 to get you home to your family sooner and support more than 3,600 jobs for local tradies.

Every day you can see the progress on the M1 and Busway extension.

In fact an extra **50 jobs** are supported every week on this project. And those tradies are hard at work on the latest components with plenty more to come:
